Dr. Marek Maria Pienkowski is a Polish-American medical researcher and clinician focused on broad aspects of immunological diagnosis and treatment. He collaborated in important discoveries related to immunology, viral oncogenes, genetic engineering, and cloning and has implemented desensitization treatments for allergic disorders based on this research into his clinical practice.

He is also recognized as a cultural ambassador for the propagation of artistic, scientific, and business dialogue between the U.S. and Poland and has been appointed by the government of Poland and accredited by the U.S. State Department as an Honorary Consul.

Recollections

As the fifth President of the Kosciuszko Foundation (the "KF"), I am indebted to my predecessors from our first President – Dr. Henry Noble MacCracken, President of Vassar College – followed by Dr. Stephen P. Mizwa, Dr. Eugene Kusielewicz and Dr. Albert Juszcak. The groundwork was already in place when I assumed the Presidency in March 1987 serving until November 2008, continuing the KF's mission to inform the American public of the contribution of the Poles to the building of the United States. It was an honor to play a part in the effort established by our founding fathers in 1925.

My tenure began during a time of political transformation in Poland, though through the foresight and determination of the KF's leadership, the KF's scholarly and student exchange programs continued.

My accomplishments are well documented in the KF's newsletters, though I highlight a few:

- Establishing a KF office in Warsaw with our first Director, Leszek Pawlowicz, formerly the Polish Bureau Chief for Time magazine in Poland
- Initiating Polish and American review commissions, along with required personal appearances, to improve the selection of candidates for grants and scholarships
- Chartering geographic KF chapters in the US from Buffalo, NY to Denver, CO
- Forming an Advisory Council consisting of KF Chapter Presidents and member volunteers
- Creating camps in Poland to teach English to young Polish students with a faculty composed of American and Polish teachers
- Extensively renovating the KF House at 15 East 65th Street, NYC – the former Van Alen mansion acquired by the KF in 1945 – to modernize the building to accommodate larger public events and programs, to preserve and showcase the art gallery and to upgrade staff offices
- Publishing the *"Polish Masters from the Kosciuszko Foundation Collection"* and the 2-volume *Polish-English/English-Polish dictionaries* (a 10-year project)
- Broadcasting live cultural and classical music events on Sundays from the KF gallery – including Marilyn Horne's *"On Wings of Song"* – over WQXR radio for many years – which burnished the KF's reputation and its mission

In March 2021, "The Joseph E. and Eugenia F. Gore Law Studies Scholarship Fund" was established with an endowment of approximately \$1 million.

May the Mission continue!

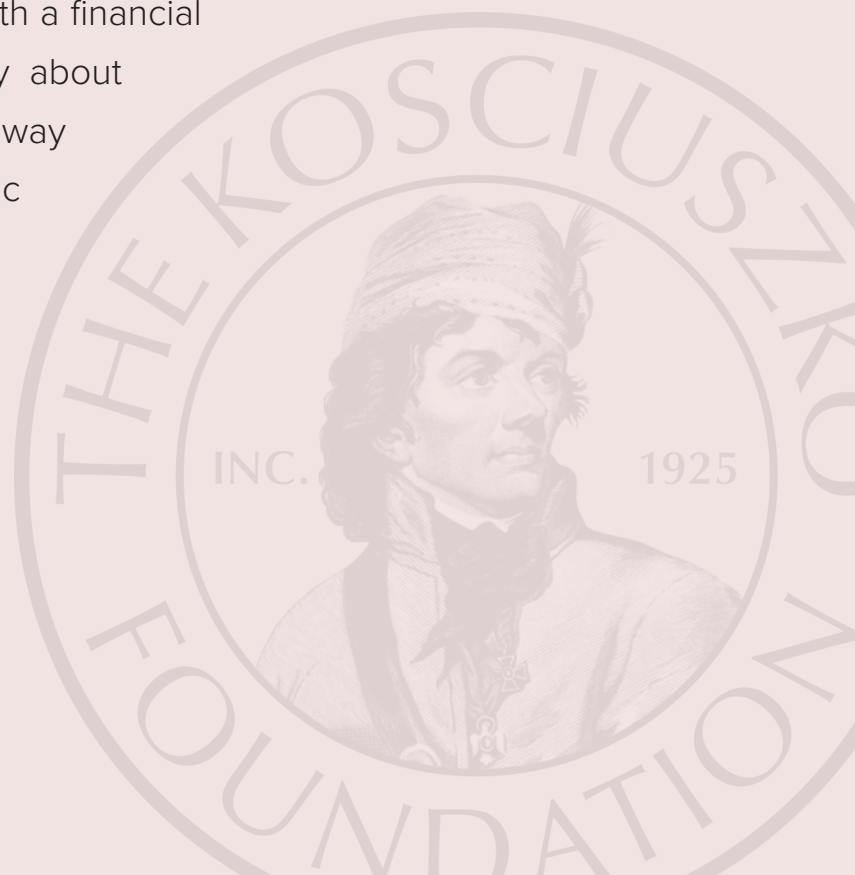

A LIVING LEGACY: 100 Years of the Kosciuszko Foundation – The Centennial Campaign

One hundred years ago, in a modest New York office, a dream took shape—one that would endure wars, economic turmoil, and political upheavals. Founded in 1925, the Kosciuszko Foundation remains a testament to the power of education and cultural exchange, honoring the legacy of Tadeusz Kościuszko, a champion of liberty in both Poland and America.

A VISION BORN FROM HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

Stephen Mizwa arrived at Ellis Island in 1910 with just \$16 and no knowledge of English. A friend's \$9 loan helped him meet the required \$25 for entry. Eleven years later, he was an assistant professor at Drake University, Des Moines, IA, embodying the American Dream.

Yet Mizwa's vision extended beyond personal success. He recognized the financial, cultural, and linguistic barriers faced by many talented Poles. In 1923, he formed the Polish American Scholarship Committee, aiming to raise \$5,000 to bring eight Polish students to the U.S. That vision soon grew into something far greater.

ESTABLISHING A LIVING MEMORIAL

As the U.S. commemorated the 150th anniversary of Kościuszko's arrival in 1926, Mizwa championed an idea: instead of another statue, why not a living memorial? Thus, the Kosciuszko Foundation was established—not as a charity, but as a bridge between two nations.

The Foundation's mission, as defined by its first President, Henry Noble MacCracken, was to foster cultural and intellectual ties between Poland and America. It would achieve this through academic exchanges, publications, and partnerships that enriched both nations.

Fundraising was a challenge. Mizwa once lamented that no economics textbook had prepared him to ask for donations that offered no tangible return—only the promise of helping young scholars. Yet people responded. The first \$5 donation came from Stephen Swierczynski in Massachusetts, and by 1925, Mizwa's dream had turned into a reality.

The Foundation's founding board included six prominent Americans committed to Poland's cause, including war hero Cedric Fauntleroy, Harvard professor Robert Lord, and Vassar College president Henry MacCracken. Though it took 45 years to reach a \$1 million endowment, the Foundation's impact was immediate.

EXPANDING EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS

Early scholarships sent Polish students to Harvard, Yale, and Columbia. Over time, programs expanded to include tuition scholarships, fellowships, Polish language study in Kraków and Lublin, and grants for Americans to research in Poland.

Through the 20th century's most turbulent moments—World War II, the Cold War, and martial law in Poland—

the Foundation remained steadfast in its mission. Postwar, it broadened its scope, launching cultural initiatives that highlighted Polish heritage and talent.

The Chopin Piano Competition (est. 1949) celebrates young musicians performing Polish compositions. The Marcella Sembrich Voice Competition and Wieniawski Violin Competition do the same for vocalists and string players, ensuring Poland's artistic legacy thrives.

Beyond music, the Foundation honors scientific excellence through prestigious awards such as the Frank Wilczek, Pienkowski, Janczewski, and Lipski Awards, which recognize outstanding Polish researchers and scholars.

A CENTURY OF IMPACT AND GLOBAL REACH

The Kosciuszko Foundation continues to evolve. In 2023 alone, it distributed over \$1.8 million in scholarships and grants, with an additional \$500,000 supporting cultural programs. The Foundation's reach now extends beyond its historic townhouse on Manhattan's Upper East Side, with offices in Washington, D.C., Warsaw, and ten active chapters across the U.S.

For the 2024–2025 academic year, the Foundation awarded grants to 40 Polish scholars to conduct research at top U.S. institutions, while six Americans pursued studies in Poland. More than 120 tuition scholarships supported Polish-American students, and 21 students participated in intensive language programs in Kraków and Lublin. Nearly 700 Polish and Ukrainian youth took part in nine Teaching English in Poland camps, led by 74 American volunteers—the largest cohort in over 30 years. Additionally, the Foundation allocated over \$100,000 for Polish Studies at U.S. institutions, including Brown University, UNC, Loyola University Chicago, Daemen University, Canisius College, and Hunter College.

Beyond academic and cultural programs, the Foundation has acted in times of crisis. Following Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine, the Board of Trustees launched a relief campaign, raising nearly

\$2 million for humanitarian aid to support Ukrainian refugees—an effort grounded in the Foundation's tradition of solidarity and service.

From Mizwa's struggles at Ellis Island to an internationally recognized institution, the Kosciuszko Foundation is a story of resilience, vision, and human connection. It stands as a living tribute to the values of Tadeusz Kościuszko: liberty, justice, and mutual respect.

LOOKING AHEAD: CENTENNIAL CAMPAIGN

As we celebrate 100 years, we honor our past while reaffirming the Foundation's vital role in today's world. In an era of rapid change, our mission—to foster understanding, promote education, and inspire cooperation—is more critical than ever. To build on this legacy and secure a brighter future for the Polish American communities, we are launching a Centennial Campaign that will strengthen our impact in the future.

KF MEDAL OF RECOGNITION



In 1955 The Kosciuszko Foundation initiated an award meant to honor special individuals who have significantly contributed to our mission of promoting cultural and intellectual exchanges between Poland and the United States.

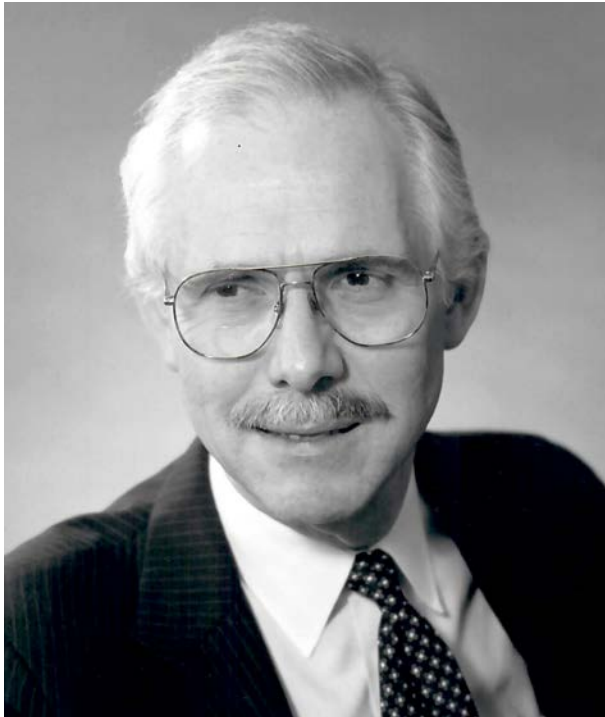
Called the Kosciuszko Foundation Medal of Recognition, the bronze medal was designed in 1955 by the Polish sculptor Tadeusz Sowinski. It features a bas-relief bust portrait of Tadeusz Kosciuszko attired in his American uniform with the Order of the Cincinnati affixed to his lapel. Encircling the portrait

are the famous words of Thomas Jefferson: "He was as pure a son of liberty as I have ever known." The reverse of the medal, depicts the lamp of knowledge and wheat stems representing internal inspiration, and centered we find the text: "The Kosciuszko Foundation Medal of Recognition for Distinguished Service to Polish and American Culture."

Generally presented during the Foundation's Annual Ball; it is not awarded annually. The first award was made to Henry Noble MacCracken for his efforts in establishing the Kosciuszko Foundation. Others who have received the award were Eric P. Kelly, Artur Rubenstein, Oscar Halecki, Wacław Lednicki, Kazimierz Wierzyński, the editors of the first Kosciuszko Foundation Dictionary – Kazimierz Bulas, Lawrence L. Thomas and Francis J. Whitfield, Leopold Stokowski, Stanisław Skrowaczewski, Maria Kuncewicz, Arthur and Marion Coleman, Edward Smith, Robert Goldstand, Stanisława Malecka-Dymnicka, Zbigniew Brzezinski, Jerzy Kozmiński, Ann T. Mikoll, Michael G. Sendzimir, Archbishop Wesoły, Jack Radgowski, Edward Pinkowski, Van Cliburn, Ryszard Kapuscinski, Wanda Tomczykowa, Marta Eggerth, President Lech Wałęsa, Dr. Maria Siemionow, Rafał Olbiński, Coach Mike Krzyzewski, Professor Frank Wilczek, Wojciech Inglot, Justyna Kowalczyk, Juliusz Machulski and Martha Stewart, Lt. JOSEPH E. GORE, Esq.



Joseph E. Gore is an attorney by profession and was admitted to practice law in the State of New York in 1959. He is also admitted to the bar for the United States Supreme Court. Born in NYC on May 2, 1934, he is the second son of Polish immigrants, Kazimiera and Mikolaj.

Joe was graduated from St. John's University with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting and a Juris Doctorate. He earned a Masters of Law degree from New York University School of Law.

After law school, Joe served his country in the US Army where he was on active duty from 1958-1960 and then as a reservist until his honorable discharge in 1964. The majority of Joe's military career was at the US Army Chemical Center in Baltimore. Joe was in the Scientific & Professional Personnel division and handled a variety of legal matters during a turbulent period in American history between the Korean and Vietnam wars.

While enlisted, he was admitted to the bar as an Attorney and Counselor at Law, New York State, First Judicial Department in 1959. Joe was a longstanding member of the American and NYS Bar Associations, NY County Lawyers' Association, Association of the Bar of the City of NY and the American Society of Corporate Secretaries.

During law school, Joe joined a group of Polish-American college graduates who met regularly at the KF for cultural and social activities. This group was known as the "Young Members" and Joe served as Vice-Chairman and Treasurer for this group in the 1960s. While in the Army, Joe would return to NYC most weekends to attend musical events, lectures, and exhibits organized by the KF's Metropolitan Chapter.

Before becoming the fifth President of the KF, Joe practiced corporate law as a senior legal officer for over 25 years with St. Regis Paper Company, a Fortune 500 company, and taught business law at Adelphi University.

Joe is a life-long student of Polish affairs and possesses an extensive library on Polish literature, history, and the arts. His special interest was the study of Joseph Conrad.

Being elected as the fifth President and Executive Director of the KF in 1987 and serving for almost 22 years until 2008, has been one of his greatest honors. Joe was guided by the KF's mission, established in 1925, and was committed to continuing Dr. Stephen P. Mizwa's goal of making the Kosciuszko Foundation a leading American institution to promote cultural and educational exchanges between Poland and the United States and to serve as a Living Memorial to Thaddeus Kosciuszko. It was the period when Communist Poland collapsed due to the Solidarity movement and a new Poland emerged. Joe saw new opportunities for the KF and established the KF's first Warsaw office in 1989. Joe's many

achievements are recorded in the KF's annals but a few are worthy of mention:

- Created the American and Polish Advisory Committees of professors and scholars to improve the selection process for scholarships and grants by interviewing candidates in Poland
- Revised and expanded the Foundation's by-laws, rules and regulations
- Established the National Advisory Council
- Opened new KF Chapters across the country
- Oversaw a \$1.5 million renovation of the mansion
- Published the second edition of the KF's Polish/English – English/Polish Dictionary
- Awarded the Silver Medal of the Jagiellonian University, Krakow, in 1997 for his "enormous efforts and energy" and devotion to the KF's activities for the benefit of the Jagiellonian University.
- Awarded the Commander's Cross of the Order

of Merit of the Republic of Poland by President Aleksander Kwaśniewski at the Presidential Palace, Warsaw, in 2000

- Presented the KF's updated Polish-English dictionary to Polish President, Aleksander Kwaśniewski in 2003
- Published a glossy catalog, The Polish Masters from the Kosciuszko Foundation Collection

Joe is currently a Trustee of the KF, Chairman of the Audit Committee, Chairman of the Executive Compensation Committee, and sits on the Executive and Scholarship Committees.

Joe's beloved wife, Eugenia (née Olinkiewicz), has been by his side throughout his career and has made many contributions to the KF as well. They have two children, Regina Gore Cavaliere and Chris Gore, and three grandchildren, Alexander, Annalise and Sophia Cavaliere.

LAW STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP FUND



WANDA SENKO



A lifelong supporter of Polish culture, **Wanda Senko** was born into a legacy of community service and cultural advocacy. Her parents, Stanislaus and Anna Pawlik, founded the Polish American Press—the first Polish printing establishment in New York City—which became a vital hub for Eastern European intellectuals and artists. Immersed in this environment from a young age, Wanda naturally grew into a central figure within the Kosciuszko Foundation and the broader Polish-American community.

For decades, Wanda has served the Foundation in numerous roles; she's served on the Board of Trustees of since 1986, and for many years was elected Vice Chairwoman of the Board and Chairwoman of several of its committees. Through these roles, she has fostered new leadership and helped expand the Foundation's national reach. Her contributions include chairing the Debutante

Ball and Debutante Council, co-founding the Pro-Arte League, and leading the National Advisory Council. She was instrumental in launching major art restoration projects and organizing collaborative events with institutions such as Hofstra University, WQXR, and the Fashion Institute of Technology.

A passionate advocate for Polish arts and education, Wanda played a key role in the development of Polish-language radio programming on Radio Free Europe and WHRU for over a decade. She introduced Polish cultural courses at Hofstra University and supported displaced Polish immigrants. She co-founded the Polish Gift of Life and the Polish Supplementary Schools of Long Island, and has served on the boards of numerous Polish-American organizations, including the Polish Children's Heartline and the Polish National Alliance of Brooklyn. Her advocacy has extended internationally, serving as a UN and court interpreter and as a consultant for global initiatives.

Beyond the Polish community, Wanda has served as Vice President of the National Grand Opera and as a Trustee of United Cerebral Palsy. A classically trained pianist, she also performed with the NYC Ballet Corps and modeled for fashion houses such as Schiaparelli and Vogue. She holds degrees in biology, public administration, gerontology, and mortuary science, and has worked as a licensed funeral director.

Wanda Senko has been the recipient of numerous awards and distinctions for her leadership and philanthropy. Her life's work has inspired four generations of her family, all of whom continue her legacy of service through the Kosciuszko Foundation and beyond.

HANNA CHROBOCZEK-KELKER, Ph.D.



Hanna Chroboczek Kelker, Ph.D. is a scientist, educator, and an advocate for Polish culture whose contributions have helped shape the mission and broaden the reach of the Kosciuszko Foundation. Since 1996, together with her husband, Dr. Norman Kelker, she has been a supporter of the Foundation's efforts to foster educational excellence through scholarships and cultural programming.

Since 2013, Dr. Kelker has proudly served on the Kosciuszko Foundation's Board of Trustees, contributing her time and expertise to numerous committees. She played a pivotal role in establishing the Foundation's Collegium of Eminent Scientists of Polish Origin and Ancestry, an initiative envisioned by the late Dr. Zbigniew Darzynkiewicz. The Collegium now includes more than 450

distinguished members, including four Nobel Prize laureates. Dr. Kelker organized a series of lectures highlighting the remarkable achievements of Polish-American scientists.

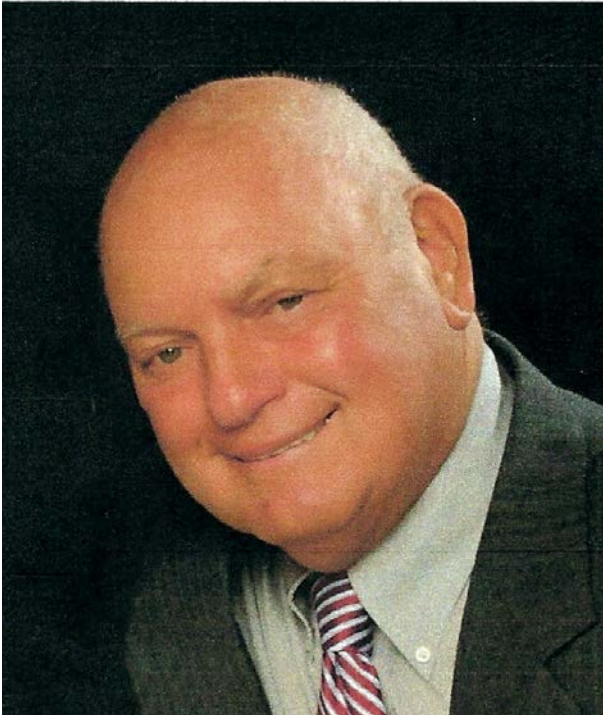
Reflecting their deep commitment to education and scientific advancement, Hanna and Norman Kelker established the Kosciuszko Foundation's Basic and Applied Science Scholarship Fund in honor of Hanna's parents, Emil and Zofia Chroboczek. This endowment supports students pursuing studies in the sciences.

The Kelkers have enriched the Foundation's cultural life. Hanna hosted a solo exhibition of her photography at the Foundation's headquarters, while Norman delivered a well-received lecture on the legacy of a pioneering Polish suffragist and he has participated in the Foundation's Teaching English in Poland Program. They proudly served as Chairs of the Foundation's 85th Annual Ball in 2022.

Born in Poland, Hanna studied at the University of Warsaw before emigrating to the United States, where she earned her Ph.D. from Michigan State University. She later conducted immunological research and held faculty positions in the Departments of Microbiology and Medicine at the NYU School of Medicine.

Hanna, a second-generation member of the Kosciuszko Foundation, carries on the legacy of her father, Dr. Emil Chroboczek—a noted horticultural scientist who earned his Ph.D. from Cornell University with a scholarship received from the Foundation founder Dr. Stephen Mizwa. Dr. Chroboczek's contributions to Polish horticulture and his close relationship with Dr. Mizwa cemented the family's lasting bond with the Foundation.

ALEXANDER KOPROSKI



Alexander “Al” Robert Koproski is a respected real estate executive, philanthropist, and lifelong advocate for Polish-American heritage. Born in Stamford, Connecticut, he earned his B.S. from Tri-State University in 1959 and served in the U.S. Army from 1955 to 1957. In 1973, he founded Al. Koproski Realty, launching a successful career marked by integrity and entrepreneurial vision.

Al’s impact extends far beyond real estate. Deeply committed to community and cultural service, he served as president of the Polish-American Business & Professional Club (1974–1979), chairman of the Kosciuszko Park Memorial Committee (1976), and founder and director of both the Polish-American Central Commission and the Polish Slavic Information Center. He also led the Holy Name Athletic Club in Stamford as president and board

chairman, contributing to youth development and civic engagement.

In 1989, Al and his wife, Patricia Velliquette Koproski, played a central role in the founding of The American Center of Polish Culture in Washington, D.C. As directors and key fundraisers, their leadership and generosity helped secure and restore a historic 1895 townhouse at 2025 O Street in Dupont Circle. Opened in 1992, the center became the first permanent home for Polonia in the nation’s capital, hosting exhibitions, concerts, lectures, and educational programs. In 2010, it became part of the Kosciuszko Foundation.

Longtime supporters of the Kosciuszko Foundation since 1985, the Koproskis have donated significant artworks, including *A Woman in a Blue Dress* by Olga Boznańska, and established the KF Building Fund to support the Foundation’s premises in New York and Washington, DC. Since 2013, Al has served on the Foundation’s Board of Trustees and chaired its Development Committee.

The Koproski Family Foundation also endowed the Koproski Lecture in Polish Business & Economy at Central Connecticut State University in 1999, promoting Polish culture and academic dialogue.

Recognized with numerous honors, including the Polonia Service Award (1994) and Citizen of the Year by the Polish-American Cultural Society (1975), Alexander Koproski’s life reflects a legacy of service, generosity, and unwavering pride in his Polish roots with the help of his wife Pat. Al is a Knight of Malta, USA for many years.

EWA RADWAŃSKA, M.D., Ph.D.



Dr. Ewa Radwańska is a pioneering physician, scientist, and educator whose career spans continents and decades, marked by her groundbreaking work in infertility treatment and her deep commitment to Polish-American scientific cooperation. A specialist in gynecological endocrinology and a champion of in vitro fertilization (IVF), Dr. Radwańska is internationally recognized for her research on progesterone.

Born in Vilnius just before the turmoil of World War II, Dr. Radwańska survived dramatic childhood hardships before pursuing her medical education at the Medical Academy in Warsaw. She trained under leading experts, including Jerzy Teter and Zygmunt Janczewski, who instilled in her the importance of the new field of endocrine gynecology. Her pursuit of excellence led her from Poland to the UK and eventually to the United States, recruited by the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1976.

She went on to work for over 40 years at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago, where she established one of the first IVF programs in the US in 1983. She also contributed greatly to the Polish-American community, serving as a longtime Vice President of the Polish-American Medical Society, a life member of the Polish Museum of America, and since 1986, a member and past President of the Chicago Chapter of the Kościuszko Foundation.

Dr. Radwańska's connection with the Kościuszko Foundation stands out as a defining element of her transatlantic legacy. Since 1996, she has served as a Trustee of the Foundation, actively contributing to the Foundation's philanthropic success and visibility. Dr. Radwańska has dedicated time, resources, and expertise through the Foundation to support Polish students, scholars, and medical professionals. She views as essential the Foundation's mission of empowering through education. Her involvement exemplifies the bridge-building ideals of the Foundation, making her a mentor to many and an ambassador of Polish-American collaboration in medicine.

Her contributions have been widely honored, including receiving an honorary doctorate (Doctor Honoris Causa) from the Medical University of Warsaw—a distinction awarded to only a handful of individuals over the institution's 90-year history. In 2012 she was awarded a Cavalier's Cross of the Order of Merit of the Republic of Poland. She is the author of many scientific publications as well as of her autobiography, *Helping Women and Mother Nature*. Beyond her scientific rigor, Dr. Radwańska is celebrated for her warmth, generosity, and unwavering dedication to helping others—be it her patients, colleagues, or the broader academic community.
